Session 1: Introduction to Design Thinking in Education

In this interactive webinar, we will:

- Explore the research and theory behind design thinking as a discipline and as it applies to teaching and learning
- Hear stories of how teachers have used design thinking to solve organizational challenges, as an approach to task design, and as a method of inquiry for students to address issues of real concern

- Define the problem to be addressed
- Ideate solutions collaboratively
- Prototype a solution to the problem
