We are living in an age of incredible complexity. Organizations from across diverse sectors including education, business, government, and the trades, are challenging themselves to re-imagine their learning cultures. **Leadership to Power Potential and Possibility** is a 4 part series that will lead participants on a personal exploration of their role in leadership, and the competencies required to support positive learning experiences for all students within the shifting educational landscape of our Alberta schools. Join us to understand how this journey is strengthened when we use different and new metaphors for leadership upon which we are able to foster powerful learning in our schools and school authorities.

Research from the fields of neuroscience, psychology and learning are providing a glimpse into the compelling potential that lies within every individual, and group of individuals - and the understanding that under the correct conditions, creativity and learning flourish. So what are those conditions?

We invite you to join Peter Gamwell, retired Superintendent of the Ottawa-Carleton District School Board and co-author of *The Wonder Wall*, for a reflective journey in leadership where participants will come to understand the essential conditions for leading creative schools in the age of complexity. This personal exploration of inquiry will begin on **May 1, 2018**, with a full day dedicated to building participants' understandings of a new leadership paradigm.

As we move into the 2018-2019 school year, the Leadership to Power Potential and Possibility learning series will continue with opportunities for participants to delve more deeply into the creation of a culture of engagement and belonging through effective leadership at all levels as a means to drive change and foster the kind of learning environments where creativity thrives. **Dates for the continuation of this learning series are: October 16, 2018; December 4, 2018; April 2, 2019.**

Born in Liverpool, England, Peter is the co-author, with Jane Daly, of *Thinker, Learner, Dreamer, Doer: Innovative Pedagogies for Cultivating Every Student's Potential* (2022) and *The Wonder Wall: Leading Creative Schools and Organizations in an Age of Complexity* (2017), forward by Sir Ken Robinson.

An insightful, entertaining, and knowledgeable speaker, presenter and consultant, Peter brings decades of academic research, experience, and insightful knowledge, gleaned from his award-winning career as a teacher and administrator at all levels of the education system. Through his presentations, workshops, books, YouTube channel, and website, he explores learning, leadership, and innovation and their impact on individual and organizational health and culture. Peter has worked across Canada and throughout many parts of the world, showing students, educators, administrators, schools, districts, companies, and policy makers how to foster that vibrancy in their own organizations.

Through the course of his work and research, Peter has captured the voices of hundreds of students and adults alike, video clips that provide unique and insightful glimpses into the lived world of our classrooms, schools and organizations. These clips also provide critical insights as to how we might imagine our learning cultures in a way that reawakens the brilliance that lies in all of us, with a central focus on individual, group, and organizational well-being.

An adjunct professor with the University of Ottawa, Peter has been the recipient of many awards through out his forty-year career including the Distinguished Leadership Award by the Ontario Public Supervisory Officers' Association and the Global Distinguished leadership Award by the Alberta Teachers' Association. In 2020, he cofounded the Canadian Network for Imagination and Creativity, @CNIC, which holds monthly IdeaJams on a wide range of topics - and which evoke lots of lively interactive conversation.



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
